Thank you for enquiring about the making of a Will. On the Resources page of dahlconnors.com you will find a Will Instruction form (both in Word or as a PDF—you may complete either one, but they are both the same document). Please complete the form and bring along with you to our first meeting (one for each person wishing to make a will). We will go through the form together so if you have any questions or cannot complete any section, we can do that together at our first meeting or you may contact me by phone or email.

At the time of making your Will, you may also wish to instruct me to prepare a Power of Attorney and Representation Agreement. The Power of Attorney allows you to appoint who you would want to sign on your behalf for simple contractual matters or banking—in the event you are incapacitated or if you are away and wish the person to act on your behalf.

The Representation Agreement covers who you would want to make medical decisions on your behalf in the event of incapacity.

The legal fee for preparation of a simple will alone is \$300.00 (plus taxes and disbursements) per person*. The legal fee for preparation of a Representation Agreement is \$150.00. The legal fee for the preparation of a Power of Attorney is \$150.00. If you choose to do all three documents at the same time (Will, Representation Agreement and Power of Attorney), there is a discount of \$100.00; therefore, a package of all three documents prepared at the same time (Will, Representation Agreement and Power of Attorney) totals \$500.00 per person. *A simple will involves the ordinary appointment of executors, guardians if any and straight forward distribution of your Estate. For more complex wills such as those with more complicated distributions, the creation of life estates or wills which involve the preparation of multiple drafts and or meetings to finalize instructions, additional legal fees will apply and will be discussed in your initial or subsequent meetings with the lawyer.
